Cuba Rhythm & Views Poised to Have its Best Season Yet as Cuba Bounces Back

On January 20, CR&V, along with Lakeshore Music, presented our good friend Aldo López-Gavilán and his trio to a sold out house at the Tempe Center for the Arts. It was an amazing show on so many levels. With several dozen of our CR&V alumni in attendance, we began our fifth year of cultural diplomacy in Cuba with a renewed sense of optimism and commitment to exposing Americans to creative life in Cuba.

As we know, it has been a rough year for Cuba. First, the new US administration curtailed travel, tightened the embargo and created fear in the minds of American travelers.

Then, in September Cuba was devastated by Hurricane Irma, one of the worst hurricanes to hit Cuba in modern history. There was wide-spread flooding around the country and the north coast agriculture and tourism sectors were completely flattened. Havana had five feet of water in the streets along the Malecón.

But we also know Cuba and Cubans are resilient. They have endured 57 years of economic embargo from the United States and still want to be our friends. They always have hope. It is the message that comes through in their inspirational art, dance and music. This is why we continue to go back.

To celebrate our fifth year in Cuba, we currently have three delegations to choose from in 2018-19 and more in the works.

May 23-30 is a reprise trip with the great trumpeter Byron Stripling. Cuba cannot get enough of Byron and word of mouth from patrons who previously traveled with us (and Byron) have nearly sold out the upcoming trip. The finale of an incredible week will be a tribute to the great George Gershwin entitled *By George: The Music of Gershwin, Cuban Style*. This performance will be held in the beautiful theater of the Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana. Accompanying Byron will be Aldo López-Gavilán and his quartet.

October 31-November 5 is a very special 5-day, Havana-only trip with internationally celebrated flautist, Elena Durán, who was invited by the Cuban government to perform during Cuba Festival de Música Contemporánea XXXI. Elena is one of the most charismatic flute players on the international concert stage today. She recently was honored to premiere *Concierto Son* (for Flute and Orchestra) composed by preeminent Mexican composer Arturo Márquez with the Mexican National Symphony Orchestra in the Palacio de Bellas Artes.

Elena will perform the Cuban premiere of this amazing work during the Festival XXXI accompanied by Orquesta Sinfónica Nacional de Cuba conducted by Guido López-Gavilán. This hugely energetic work concludes with a soaring conga, that will most certainly demand an encore. Elena will also work with Cuba's best and brightest students at Instituto Superior de Arte, the national conservatory.

January 4-11, 2019 is our collaboration with harmonica virtuoso Robert Bonfiglio and the prestigious Grand Canyon Music Festival. Robert, co-founder of the Grand Canyon Music Festival, will perform with the Havana Chamber Orchestra and again with some of Havana's most renowned jazz musicians at Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes de La Habana.

Described by the music critic for the *Los Angeles Times*, as "the Paganini of the harmonica," Robert is known for his many recordings and live performances featuring the instrument.

Bonfiglio has performed harmonica concertos as the soloist with over 200 major orchestras including Minnesota Orchestra, Orchestre de la Suisse Romande, Buenos Aires Philharmonic of Teatro Colón, Luxembourg Philharmonic, Leipzig MDR-Radio Symphony, Hong Kong Philharmonic, Rotterdam Philharmonic, as well as Pittsburgh Symphony, National Symphony, Boston Pops, New York Pops and dozens of others.

Nowadays the Terry Theater is a cultural institution with a solid schedule of performances from artists from all points of the globe.

Miguel, through the Ministry of Culture, ensures that all our cultural events are sanctioned by the government and takes care of performance visas for our visiting artists. He lives in Cienfuegos and is our host when we visit his beautiful city.
